JOHN: Thanks.

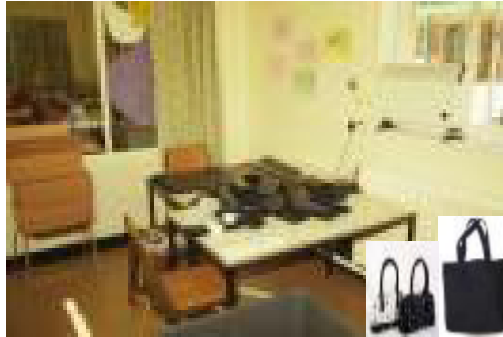
