VOCABULARY:

Weather- the state of the atmosphere with respect to heat or cold, wetness or dryness, calm or storm, clearness or cloudiness

Terrible-extremely bad: as **a**: strongly repulsive: **b**: notably unattractive or objectionable **c**: of very poor quality

Vacation- period spent away from home or business in travel or recreation
