VOCABULARY:

Backache - An ache or pain in the back, especially the lower back.

Stomachache - Pain in the stomach or abdomen.

Headache - A pain in the head.

Toothache - An aching pain in or near a tooth.

Cold - A viral infection characterized by inflammation of the mucous membranes lining the upper respiratory passages and usually accompanied by malaise, fever, chills, coughing, and sneezing. Also called **common cold, coryza**.

Cough - To expel air from the lungs suddenly and noisily, often to keep the respiratory passages free of irritating material.

Fever - Abnormally high body temperature.
